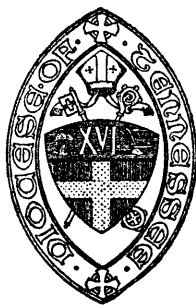

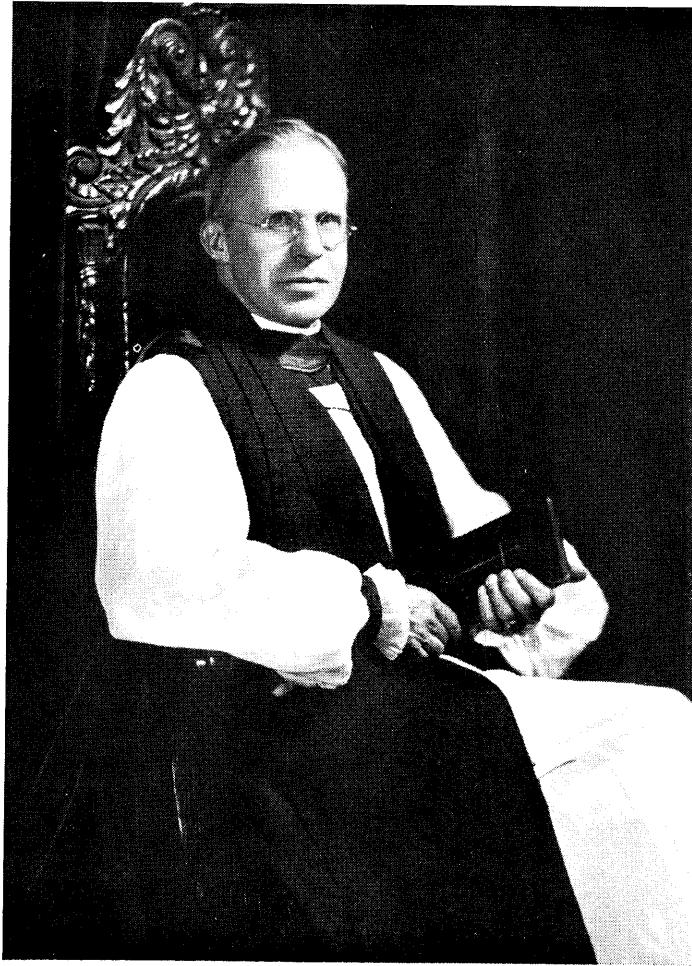

The Order of Service

The Procession of Laity, Clergy, and the Bishop shall enter the Cathedral singing the

Processional Hymn, "God of Our Fathers" 145

Then shall be said Psalms 122 and 46, and the Creed, the Bishop standing in the midst of the choir, and the others in their accustomed places.

The Creed ended, the Bishop shall kneel before the entrance to the sanctuary, all others standing; and the Senior Priest shall say:

Good People, we are here met in the sight of God, to receive, and install in his office, him who has been elected and consecrated to the office and dignity of Bishop of this Diocese. We ask you to give reverent heed to that which we do, and to offer your earnest prayers that the grace of God may be with us in our undertaking, and may rest upon him now to be installed as our Bishop.

Let the Certification now be read.

The Chancellor of the Diocese shall then read the Certification.

The Senior Priest, addressing the Bishop, shall then say:

You, the Right Reverend Edmund Pendleton Dandridge, Doctor of Divinity, have been duly elected according to the Will of God and the Canons of this Church, and duly consecrated to the office and dignity of Bishop of the Diocese of Tennessee.

We, representing the Clergy and People of this Diocese, do ask of you, in the Name of God, your intention and purpose in respect thereof.

The Bishop shall answer:

I, Edmund Pendleton Dandridge, by the grace of God Bishop of this Diocese of Tennessee, do promise and declare that it is my intention and purpose, well and faithfully to rule and govern the Church in this Diocese; that I will firmly observe the rights and privileges of both Clergy and People, and the laws of the State; I will observe all the statutes and ordinances of this Cathedral Church; and, as much as in me lies, will take care that they are observed by others; and I will also endeavor to promote the welfare and honour of the Diocese and of this Cathedral Church. So help me God. Amen.

Minister. The Law was given by Moses;

Minister and People. Who is God over all, blessed for evermore. Amen.

Minister. The Lord be with you.

Answer. And with thy spirit.

Minister. Let us pray.

Most gracious Father, the giver of all good and perfect gifts, Who of Thy wise Providence hast appointed divers Orders in Thy Church; Give Thy Grace, we beseech Thee, to Thy servant, to whom the charge of this Diocese is now committed; and so replenish him with the truth of Thy doctrine, and endue him with innocency of life, that he may faithfully serve before Thee, to the glory of Thy great Name, and the benefit of Thy Holy Church; through Jesus Christ our only Mediator and Redeemer. Amen.

Then, all standing, shall be sung

Hymn, "Come, Holy Ghost, our souls inspire" 217

After which, the Senior Priest and Chancellor shall conduct the Bishop to the EPISCOPAL CHAIR, and shall place him therein, saying:

We, Prentice Andrew Pugh, Senior Priest and President of the Standing Committee of the Diocese of Tennessee, and Samuel Bartow Strang, Chancellor of the Diocese of Tennessee, do hereby Induct and Install you, the Right Reverend Edmund Pendleton Dandridge, Doctor of Divinity, into the real, actual and corporal possession of the Bishopric, and Cathedral Church of Saint Mary, of the Diocese of Tennessee, and do place you in the Episcopal Chair, In the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost; promising for ourselves and the Diocese all honour and obedience to your person and office as to our Father in God. The Lord preserve thy going out and thy coming in, henceforth and for evermore. Amen.
