



Announcements

AID RELIEF FOR VICTIMS OF HURRICANE SANDY

The pictures of devastation shown by the news media coming in from coastal New Jersey, New York City, and Connecticut are unthinkable, and yet Nashville knows precisely what is facing the communities hardest hit by the floods and winds of the recent hurricane. We also have two direct connections to ministries in the area: St. Simon's Episcopal Church, Mantoloking, NJ, where the Dean serves while on vacation during the summer, and Christ Church, Summit, NJ, where Matthew Corkern is the rector. In Mantoloking, the church building of St. Simon's is still standing but with significant damage. TV stations are reporting that 20 homes have been washed out to sea. A similar number were moved off their foundations and into the bay. Numerous year-round residents have had no place to turn. For some it will be months, if not years, before they have a place to call home again. In Summit, power outages and flood waters have displaced numerous local residents. Last night Christ Church opened its door and more than 150 people took shelter on the campus of this prominent parish in the Summit community. Any checks received in the Cathedral office will be split 50/50 and sent directly to the Senior Wardens of St. Simon's, Mantoloking and Christ Church, Summit to aid in the hurricane relief needed in their respective communities.

What is the role of the laity in our churches?

In the Catholic Church of the Victorian era, one English Monsignor notoriously answered: "To hunt, to shoot, to entertain. These matters they understand, but to meddle with ecclesiastical matters they have no right at all." In a study prepared for the recent General Convention, a different answer was given: "The Episcopal Church has historically embraced and legitimized laity, bishops and clergy equally to take their place in the governance of the church." Dr. Benjamin J. King's lectures will examine the various roles of the laity since New Testament times so that we might better understand what the role of the laity could be today.
