Nancy Reiser joined the staff of St. George's Episcopal Church, Nashville, as Director of Music Ministries in August 2012. A native of Jacksonville, Florida, she began organ studies with Andrew Clarke while a student at the Bolles School. She received the Bachelor of Arts degree from the University of the South, studying organ and choral conducting with Robert Delcamp, and the Master of Music degree from the Cleveland Institute of Music, studying organ with Todd Wilson and accompanying with Anne Epperson. From 1994-2008, Ms. Reiser served as Organist-Choirmaster of St. Mark's Episcopal Church in Jacksonville, FL. She also has held church music posts in Sewanee, TN, Cleveland, OH, Nashville, TN, and most recently has been Organist-Choirmaster of All Saints' Episcopal Church in Austin, TX. She was second prize winner in the 1991 Gruenstein National Organ Competition, and has been the winner of several A.G.O scholarship competitions. She has served on the faculty of several national conferences for Church Music, Organ Pedagogy, and Liturgy.
