This year the pilgrimage will be to Murfreesboro, where the group will learn about the Battle of Stones River and explore the cultural and spiritual forces at work when the battle took place. The day will begin with a visit to the Heritage Festival of Bradley Academy Museum and Cultural Center, celebrating African American culture during the Civil War, followed by lunch, Holy Communion at the Central Christian Church, and a tour of the Stones River Battlefield, where thousands of Confederate and Union troops were killed in a pivotal battle. 

**COVENANT: THE CONTINUING CONVERSATION
THE REVEREND DR. WALTER BRUEGGEMANN**

These presentations will explore how the covenants of Abraham and Moses serve as a pattern of life supported by biblical faith that can be seen as an alternative to the commodity-driven life of current culture.



Dr. Brueggemann is known throughout the world for his method of combining literary and sociological modes when reading the Bible. He is the William Marcellus McPheeters Professor Emeritus of Old Testament at Columbia Theological Seminary. He is a past president of the Society of Biblical Literature and an ordained minister in the United Church of Christ. He has written over 50 books, most recently *Disruptive Grace: David and His Theologian* and *The Practice of Prophetic Imagination*.
