
COLLECT OF THE DAY

THE NEW TESTAMENT LESSON – Romans 11:1-2a, 29-32



THE GOSPEL LESSON – Matthew 15:10-28

Jesus called the crowd to him and said to them, “Listen and understand: it is not what goes into the mouth that defiles a person, but it is what comes out of the mouth that defiles.” Then the disciples approached and said to him, “Do you know that the Pharisees took offense when they heard what you said?” He answered, “Every plant that my heavenly Father has not planted will be uprooted. Let them alone; they are blind guides of the blind. And if one blind person guides another, both will fall into a pit.” But Peter said to him, “Explain this parable to us.” Then he said, “Are you also still without understanding? Do you not see that whatever goes into the mouth enters the stomach, and goes out into the sewer? But what comes out of the mouth proceeds from the heart, and this is what defiles. For out of the heart come evil intentions, murder, adultery, fornication, theft, false witness, slander. These are what defile a person, but to eat with unwashed hands does not defile.”

Jesus left Gennesaret and went away to the district of Tyre and Sidon. Just then a Canaanite woman from that region came out and started shouting, “Have mercy on me, Lord, Son of David; my daughter is tormented by a demon.” But he did not answer her at all. And his disciples came and urged him, saying, “Send her away, for she keeps shouting after us.” He answered, “I was sent only to the lost sheep of the house of Israel.” But she came and knelt before him, saying, “Lord, help me.” He answered, “It is not fair to take the children’s food and throw it to the dogs.” She said, “Yes, Lord, yet even the dogs eat the crumbs that fall from their masters’ table.” Then Jesus answered her, “Woman, great is your faith! Let it be done for you as you wish.” And her daughter was healed instantly.

VOLUNTEERS NEEDED FOR HABITAT FOR HUMANITY UNITY BUILD

Christ Church Cathedral will participate in the 2014 Habitat For Humanity Unity Build on Sunday, September 21, partnering with volunteers from the West End Synagogue. About 25 volunteers are needed to help install kitchen cabinets, finish interior painting, install countertops, and complete the front porch.

The house is being built for Khalid and Birtukan Beyene, who have been living in a one-bedroom apartment with their two children since immigrating to Nashville in 2011. Registration will begin at 7 a.m. at the work site in the Edison Park subdivision in Antioch. Work will start promptly at 7:30 a.m. and should be finished by 3:30 p.m. A Eucharistic Visitor will be sent from the 8:30 a.m. Liturgy at the Cathedral to bring Communion to all Cathedral volunteers. In addition to the 25 volunteers needed for construction work, Habitat recommends three additional volunteers to handle breakfast and coffee, and five additional volunteers to coordinate lunch and snacks.
