

THE NEW TESTAMENT LESSON – 1 Thessalonians 1:1-10

Paul, Silvanus, and Timothy, To the church of the Thessalonians in God the Father and the Lord Jesus Christ:

Grace to you and peace.

We always give thanks to God for all of you and mention you in our prayers, constantly remembering before our God and Father your work of faith and labor of love and steadfastness of hope in our Lord Jesus Christ. For we know, brothers and sisters beloved by God, that he has chosen you, because our message of the gospel came to you not in word only, but also in power and in the Holy Spirit and with full conviction; just as you know what kind of persons we proved to be among you for your sake. And you became imitators of us and of the Lord, for in spite of persecution you received the word with joy inspired by the Holy Spirit, so that you became an example to all the believers in Macedonia and in Achaia. 

THE GOSPEL LESSON – Matthew 22:15-22

The Pharisees went and plotted to entrap Jesus in what he said. THE REVEREND DR. DAVID MARSHALL



In these sessions, Dr. David Marshall will offer an introduction to the key beliefs and practices of Islam as well as look at various expressions of Islam in the modern world. Along the way, he will also examine similarities and differences between Islam and Christianity and reflect on Christian responses to Islam.

The Reverend Marshall has served as a parish priest and has taught in a variety of settings, including the universities of Edinburgh, Oxford, and Notre Dame in London, as well as in an ecumenical theological school in Kenya. He also served as chaplain to the Archbishop of Canterbury from 2000-2005. Before joining the Duke Divinity School faculty in Spring 2013, the Reverend Marshall worked as a research fellow the Berkley at Center for Religion, Peace, & World Affairs at Georgetown University, serving as the academic director of the Archbishop of Canterbury's Building Bridges Seminar for Christian and Muslim scholars. He continues to be involved in this project. He is married with two children.
