THE OLD TESTAMENT LESSON – Isaiah 6:1-8

In the year that King Uzziah died, I saw the LORD sitting on a throne, high and lofty; and the hem of his robe filled the temple. Seraphs were in attendance above him; each had six wings: with two they covered their faces, and with two they covered their feet, and with two they flew. And one called to another and said:

“Holy, holy, holy is the LORD of hosts;  
the whole earth is full of his glory.”

The pivots on the thresholds shook at the voices of those who called, and the house filled with smoke. And I said: “Woe is me! I am lost, for I am a man of unclean lips, and I live among a people of unclean lips; yet my eyes have seen the King, the LORD of hosts!”

Then one of the seraphs flew to me, holding a live coal that had been taken from the altar with a pair of tongs. The seraph touched my mouth with it and said: “Now that this has touched your lips, your guilt has departed and your sin is blotted out.” Then I heard the voice of the LORD saying, “Whom shall I send, and who will go for us?” And I said, “Here am I; send me!”

THE NEW TESTAMENT LESSON – Romans 8:12-17

So then, brothers and sisters, we are debtors, not to the flesh, to live according to the flesh-- for if you live according to the flesh, you will die; but if by the Spirit you put to death the deeds of the body, you will live. For all who are led by the Spirit of God are children of God. For you did not receive a spirit of slavery to fall back into fear, but you have received a spirit of adoption. When we cry, "Abba! Father!" it is that very Spirit bearing witness with our spirit that we are children of God, and if children, then heirs, heirs of God and joint heirs with Christ-- if, in fact, we suffer with him so that we may also be glorified with him.

THE GOSPEL LESSON – John 3:1-17

There was a Pharisee named Nicodemus, a leader of the Jews. He came to Jesus by night and said to him, "Rabbi, we know that you are a teacher who has come from God; for no one can do these signs that you do apart from the presence of God." Jesus answered him, "Very truly, I tell you, no one can see the kingdom of God without being born from above." Nicodemus said to him, "How can anyone be born after having grown old? Can one enter a second time into the mother's womb and be born?" Jesus answered, "Very truly, I tell you, no one can enter the kingdom of God without being born of water and Spirit. What is born of the flesh is flesh, and what is born of the Spirit is spirit. Do not be astonished that I said to you, 'You must be born from above.' The wind blows where it chooses, and you hear the sound of it, but you do not know where it comes from or where it goes. So it is with everyone who is born of the Spirit." Nicodemus said to him, "How can these things be?" Jesus answered him, "Are you a teacher of Israel, and yet you do not understand these things?

"Very truly, I tell you, we speak of what we know and testify to what we have seen; yet you do not receive our testimony. If I have told you about earthly things and you do not believe, how can you believe if I tell you about heavenly things? No one has ascended into heaven except the one who descended from heaven, the Son of Man. And just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, that whoever believes in him may have eternal life.

"For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life.

"Indeed, God did not send the Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him."

## MAY ECONOMIC JUSTICE CHALLENGE: REDUCE THE PACKAGING WE USE

*Grant that we, remembering the account we must one day give, may be faithful stewards of your good gifts. (BCP, p 259).*



One way of being faithful stewards of the gifts of creation is not to use more than is necessary. This month, we challenge you to pay attention to how much packaging is in things you use and work to reduce your use of packaging. A few easy ways to start: Bring reusable bags whenever you shop (keep some handy in your car or purse). When making purchasing choices, consider the amount and type of packaging, and give preference to items with less and/or recyclable packaging. Bring your own travel mug to the coffee shop and your own refillable water bottle to work. Let's work this month to follow the common "Reduce, reuse, recycle" mantra for good creation stewardship!

## WEDNESDAY BIBLE STUDY

The Wednesday Bible Study will begin the book of *Acts* on June 10. This is a good opportunity to join the group at the beginning of a new book. You might be especially interested if you have been watching *A.D. The Bible Continues*, which focuses on the first ten chapters of *Acts*. Join us as we read, question, and debate. ## EDUCATION FOR MINISTRY (EfM)



EfM is a Christian education and formation program developed by the School of Theology at Sewanee, which takes place at Episcopal churches across the country and online. EfM covers the basics of a theological education in the Old and New Testaments, church history, liturgy, and theology with emphasis on theological reflection. Students enroll for one year at a time, and complete the course in four years. More information is available on the EfM website, [efm.sewanee.edu](http://efm.sewanee.edu). The cost is \$350/year. Partial scholarships may be available. Christ Church groups meet on Tuesday evenings or Wednesday mornings during the academic year and each has room for a limited number of new students. 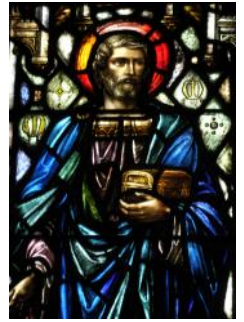

## ST. MATTHEW WINDOW

Given to the Glory of God and in Memory of A. H. Robinson. The window was given by Delia Baxter Robinson in memory of her husband. A. H. Robinson served 27 years as a Vestryman including seven years as Senior Warden. He was on the Vestry at Old Christ Church from 1876 through 1893. He served again at "new" Christ Church on 9th and Broadway from 1909 until his death in 1919.

St. Matthew is one of the four Gospel Windows, designed in 1928, by the Geissler & Company of New York. The Gospel windows are located above the Columbarium.
