

THE MARBLE CROSS

GIVEN TO THE GLORY OF GOD AND IN MEMORY OF
REBECCA ALLISON PORTER.

On October 6, 1923, Bishop James M. Maxon dedicated the Marble Cross given in memory of their mother Rebecca Allison Porter by Misses Rebecca and Matilda Porter. The Porters' family home was on the corner of Spruce (8th Avenue South) and Demonbreun. The Carrara marble cross is adorned with Easter lilies symbolizing the Resurrection. A dedicatory plaque is below the cross. The cross was conserved, by Shelley Reisman Paine, in 2007, with a gift from David Graves and his wife Gloria Graves, granddaughter of Mrs. Porter. The Marble Cross is located on the east wall (right side) of the nave.

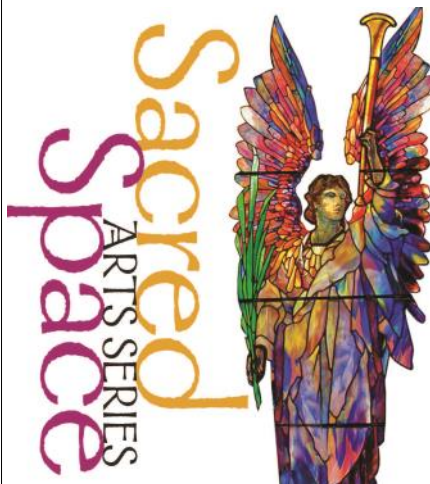
