THE GOSPEL LESSON – Luke 3:7-18

John said to the crowds that came out to be baptized by him, “You brood of vipers! Who warned you to flee from the wrath to come? Bear fruits worthy of repentance. Do not begin to say to yourselves, ‘We have Abraham as our ancestor’; for I tell you, God is able from these stones to raise up children to Abraham. Even now the ax is lying at the root of the trees; every tree therefore that does not bear good fruit is cut down and thrown into the fire.”

And the crowds asked him, “What then should we do?” In reply he said to them, “Whoever has two coats must share with anyone who has none; and whoever has food must do likewise.” Even tax collectors came to be baptized, and they asked him, “Teacher, what should we do?” He said to them, “Collect no more than the amount prescribed for you.” Soldiers also asked him, “And we, what should we do?” He said to them, “Do not extort money from anyone by threats or false accusation, and be satisfied with your wages.”

STAINED GLASS WINDOWS IN THE CHAPEL ARCHES GIVEN TO THE GLORY OF GOD AND TO CHRIST CHURCH BY MR. AND MRS. SEAWELL BRANDAU



Ethel Hawkinson and Seawell Brandau were married in the Chapel on March 1, 1935, by the Reverend E.P. Dandridge, Rector of Christ Church. They were longtime members of Christ Church. The stained glass windows were added in the arches between the Chapel and the Nave to provide more privacy for Chapel services. The windows, designed by Emmanuel Stained Glass Studios, Nashville, were placed in the arches in 1992.
