before the hills, I was brought forth--

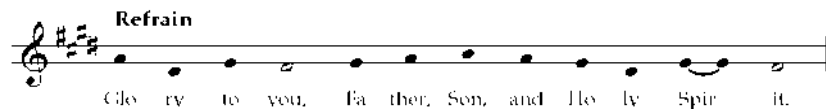
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when he had not yet made earth and fields,
